## Snowbasin Kid's Safety Poster Contest

Program Description: The contest targets elementary-age children 5-11 years old. The students are asked to create a poster related to any one of the ten points in "Your Responsibility Code" or any one of the five PARK SMART Elements. Prizes will be awarded!

**Our Mission:** To promote slope safety awareness and education to elementary school children, to support classroom curriculum related to sports, health and safety, and to give kids a chance to have fun and be creative while learning about slope safety.

## **Rules for Poster Design:**

- Students individually create a poster based on one or more of the ten elements of "YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE" or five elements of "PARK SMART".
- Use this official entry form to submit entries, otherwise a 8 1/2" x 11" or 11" x 17" poster size is recommended
- Students should use pencils, crayons, paint and other materials (no macaroni) readily available in schools in their poster design or at the stations set up in the Snowbasin Bag Check area or Ski & Ride School Cub Den.
- Complete form on the front of the poster about the contestant using parent/guardian's contact info.
- Posters and Entry forms are submitted by turning in at Ski & Ride School Ticket Desk by 01/31/2024.

Local Contest: Local Snowbasin winners will be selected in two categories - 1. BEST OVERALL SAFETY MESSAGE (Winner receives 2024-25 Youth Season Pass) 2. MOST CREATIVE DESIGN (Winner receives 2024-25 Youth Season Pass) Wining designs are entered into the National Contest outlined below. All posters submitted to the local contest will become the property of Snowbasin Resort Company. Winners of the Local Contest will be announced in February 2024.

National Contest: Selection of the national winning posters will be made by the NSAA Poster Contest Committee on an objective and non-discriminatory basis. Winners will be selected in two categories, including best overall safety message, and most creative design. Selection will be based on the poster's connection to safety, visual impact, and originality. All posters submitted to the national contest will become the property of the National Ski Areas Association. Winners will receive a free helmet, be published in the NSAA Journal along with other national awards at the discretion of NSAA. All entries for the national contest should be submitted by 03/01/2024. Winners of the national contest will be announced in April 2024









Your Responsibility Code: As you enjoy the slopes show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a great experience on the slopes.

- 1. Always stay in control. You must be able to stop or avoid people or objects
- 2. People head or downhill of you have the right-of-way. You must avoid them.
- 3. Stop only where you are visible from above and do not restrict traffic.
- 4. Look uphill and avoid others before starting downhill or entering a trail.
- 5. You must prevent runaway equipment.
- 6. Read and obey all signs, warnings and hazard markings.
- 7. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 8. You must know how and be able to load, ride and unload lifts safely. If you need assistance, ask the lift attendant.
- 9. Do not use lifts or terrain when impaired by alcohol or drugs.
- 10. If you are involved in a collision or incident, share your contact information with each other and a ski area employee.

PARK SMART Elements: Terrain Park safety is important to all ski/riders that use freestyle terrain.
